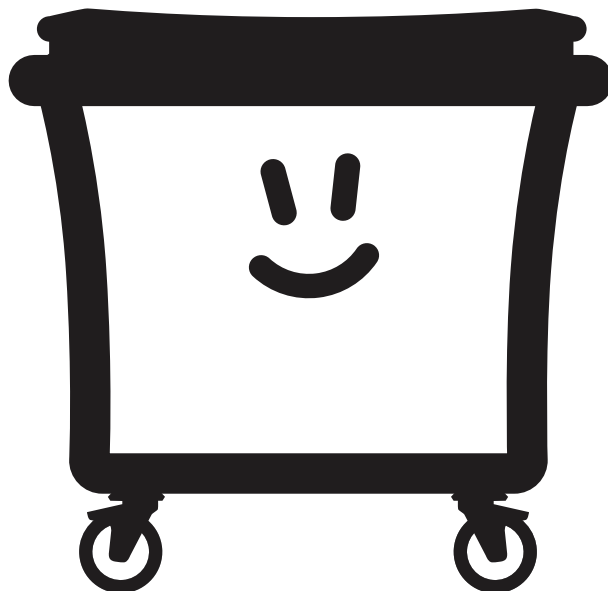


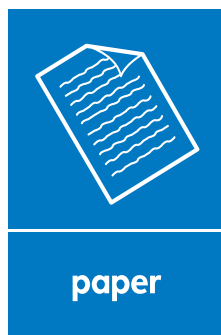
Bournemouth's Recycling Scheme
