# Early Help Programmes

## Areas of support

### Parenting and Young Parents (pre-birth to 19 years)

Our evidenced based programmes are delivered by trained Early Help Professionals and are offered through a blended response, this could be in groups in one of the Family Hubs, virtual online via zoom or face to face depending on the needs of the family. The parenting groups each focus on child development, building positive relationships, managing age and stage expectations and impart skills in coping with and overcoming challenging behaviour.

### Communication and Language (pre-birth to rising 4 years)

There are three separate interventions available to support parents and their children aged pre-birth to four years old within the Communication, Language and Literacy Programme. One for parents and their children pre-birth to 3 months, one for parents and children 3 to 12 months and one for parents and children age 2 and 3 years.

### Home Learning (0 to 5yrs)

Home learning programmes focus on the Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED) and Physical development (PD) of children. All programmes are child and parent play centred, using low cost/no cost ideas and aim to increase parental confidence and knowledge of child development by considering the home learning environment, brain development and acknowledgment of parents as their child's first and most enduring educator.

### Brighter Futures (5 to 16 years)

Active support and provision of resources for parents are vital. Brighter Futures will recommend a comprehensive support package for parents across the age range of 5-16 years, utilising a multi-agency and community approach in identifying and promoting the home learning environment, particularly targeted to vulnerable families.
