1	WELCOME AND APOLOGIES (BC)	
	BC welcomed everyone to the meeting and introductions were made.

2	MINUTES OF LAST MEETING (BC)	
	In relation to the Skills work, CE thought it would help to liaise with WHCE about the Job Centre Provision - Outstanding	CE
	BC asked that Steve Mowlem to be invited to a future meeting to update on progress. SM had not been invited this time but MS updated on progress with Fernheath Sports. They have submitted	

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	their planning application and are fundraising to replace the Pavilion. Lease required from BBC to support applications.	
3	DIABETES PEER SUPPORT PROJECT(SB)	
	In Chris Pitts absence (Project Manager) SB updated that the Task and Finish group have been meeting and held a meeting to explore the establishment of Type 2 Diabetes peer support on the 11 January. It was successful and the T&F group will meet again to take this forward. At the next meeting they have invited a doctor along to speak and will also use GPs Social Network to try and get more local people involved - the main challenge in setting this up. Alex from LiveWell will take over from Chris and West Howe Health Helpers will assist with recruiting people to the group.	
	Agreed to keep this item on the agenda for next time, to update on progress.	HF
4	YOUNG PEOPLE'S OUTCOMES(CA)	
	CA has taken the lead on the challenge posed at the last meeting re researching the needs of C&YP / service provision to enable the Partnership to add value to existing work. CA stressed there's no point in doing work that tells us what we already know. The current picture is as follows:	
	 Children's Centre - The Children Society are not carrying on with the contract so the Council is bringing the service back in-house and will keep the same staff / management. From April 2017 Health Visitors will work alongside the Children's Centre to help 0-5 year olds. Library will relocate to CC site (extension) bringing service together and making it more family oriented. Achieve Together carried out a useful "Virtual Schools Analysis" that can be repeated across all the LSOA's There are changes in leadership taking place at the local schools who will be looking at improving their outcomes. It will be useful to bring together a federation of organisations supporting children and young people - possibly setting up an event/conference as a first step (like the mental health work) There is good youth service provision, but a gap for 10 - 13 year olds. Concerns about the transition from Primary to Secondary schools 	CA

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	 There will be a serious case review following the death of a young person last year. The outcomes may inform our work. Agreed action to get all the agencies together, possibly in a "Blue Café" style event. 	CA
5	SKILLS - "HOWE INSPIRING(SB) & (MS)	
	The steering group agreed a specification and 4 providers are now delivering. A launch event was held at Henry Brown to get people to sign up to the courses on offer. See the video: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=JPgGvIUj-pY WHC Enterprises are coordinating the provision, monitoring and evaluation. At the next meeting more information will be provided from monitoring data but so far good progress has been made with more opportunities available for local people. Only one provider is struggling with take up but they will be assisted. Work experience has also been made available at the Council. Next steps Consider sustainability Provide hard data on numbers and what they are achieving Bring mainstream providers around the table	SB
6	WELLBEING (MS)	
	The 5 Ways Wellbeing newsletter were all successfully delivered to homes and buildings in the West Howe area. ESOL has been identified as a need.	
	 Provision includes: Let's Chat Mental Health befriending, Dorset Mind have 10 volunteers Faithworks Wessex intergenerational meal (33 at last event). Paul Scadding - personal development Acupuncture Eco walks (later in the spring) A spreadsheet tracks individuals and the courses they are attending.	
	There was a discussion about how we will know we have made a difference as a result of the Howe Inspiring and the Wellbeing work.	

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	This will mainly be through monitoring the individuals who take part and their "journey". Will also track a population level but this will be more challenging. To be explored.	SB
	Agreed to look into regular provision of a newsletter, exploring possibility of BH Live advertising to cover or contribute to the cost.	MS
7	CUNNINGHAM CRESCENT (MB) & (SB)	
	SB updated on the significant multi agency work that is progressing linked to the potential re-location of the Library. This may enable other developments on Cunningham Crescent, improved facilities, housing and improvements to the highway. AG mentioned the need to ensure youth facilities are not next to housing as this can bring problems.	SB
	SD mentioned that the plans for flats on Cunningham Crescent will not go ahead but the possibility of developing some houses is now being considered.	
	Agreed that at the next meeting plans will be examined.	SB
8	B2026 FUNDING (SB)	
9	 Sue presented the report. Recommendations were agreed: Hold allocation for Design Council to support Cunningham Crescent work Reallocate hanging baskets funding to signage Business cases to be brought forward for the £30k B2026 allocation The signage was proposed as the hanging baskets are technically impossible to hang on the lampposts. Instead a "Welcome to West Howe" sign in 2 areas, Fernheath Rd and Poole Lane, was discussed. It will cost around £3,000. MS to confirm price and progress. Cllr Marley mentioned a Cinema Survey that was carried out - 37 people completed the survey. He asked for volunteers for the Cinema SB mentioned that the £30k is the final allocation from B2026 AOB	MS
