

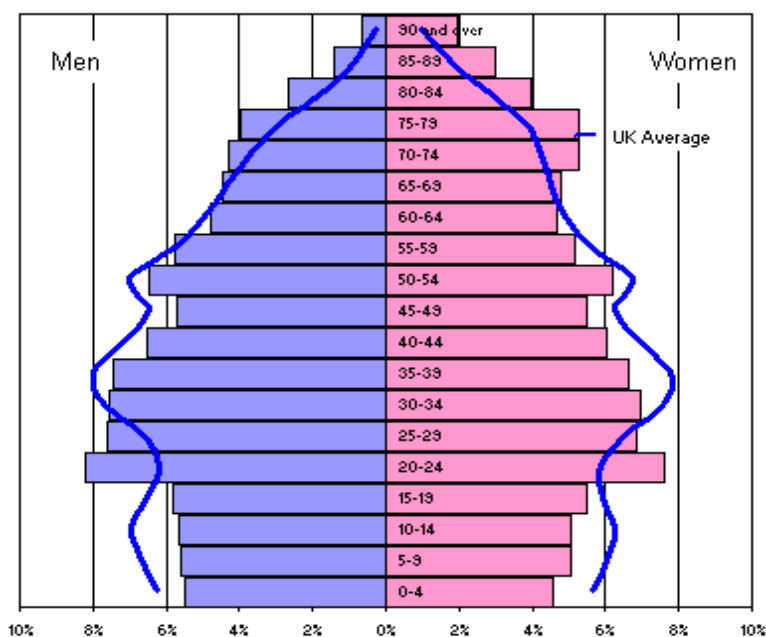

## **Notes relating to the Bournemouth Profile of Key Statistics**

### **Rankings:**

For each indicator shown in the Census profile, the area's ranking among the 376 local and unitary authorities within England and Wales; and its ranking within Wales or the relevant English Government Office Region( South West) is shown.

In each case, rankings are calculated in descending order: the authority with the highest proportion for a given indicator is ranked '1'. It is important to note that all rankings are calculated based on percentage size and not numerical values. ONS makes no comment as to the merits of high or low ranking for any indicator. Please bear in mind that, in some circumstances, areas may have exactly the same value for a given indicator, and may therefore be 'tied' for positions in the ranking.

1 'Age' is age last birthday.

2. Care must be taken when interpreting intercensal population change, as there have been changes in definition between 1991 and 2001, and the 2001 counts have been adjusted to account for under-enumeration

3. Area measurements are based on the 2001 version of the OS Boundary-Line data-set, amended where district boundaries have changed since 2001, and do not include inland water.

4. 'Other EU countries' includes United Kingdom, part not specified, Ireland, part not specified, Channel Islands and Isle of Man. The European Union as defined on Census day (29 April 2001).

5. Limiting long-term illness covers any long-term illness, health problem or disability which limits daily activities or work. General health refers to health over the 12 months prior to Census day(29 April 2001). Provision of unpaid care: looking after, giving help or support to family members, friends, neighbours or others because of long-term physical or mental ill-health or disability or problems relating to old age.

6. 'People who moved within the area' includes people with no usual address one year before the Census which took place on 29 April 2001. ' People who moved out of the area' is calculated using people whose address one year ago was within the area but whose current address is outside the area but within the UK, expressed as a percentage of current population of the area.

7. For the purposes of this table, a lone parent is defined as a parent with a dependent child living in a household with no other persons(whether related to that dependent child or not). A dependent child is a person in a household aged 0 – 15 (whether or not in a family) or a person aged 16 – 18 who is a full-time student in a family with parent(s).

The overcrowded indicator provides a measure of under-occupancy and overcrowding. For example, a value of -1 implies there is one room too few and that there is overcrowding in the household. The occupancy rating assumes that every household, including one person households, requires a minimum of two common rooms (excluding bathrooms).

8. Includes any company car or van if available for private use.

9. For long-term unemployed, the year last worked is 1999 or earlier.

10. 'Employed' includes anyone who did paid work in the week before the Census, including those self-employed. For this data, economically active students have been classified separately.

'Other' includes other community, social and personal service activities, private households with employed persons, extra territorial organisations and bodies.

11. For the purposes of this table profile, public transport is defined as Underground, metro, light rail or tram; train; bus, minibus or coach
