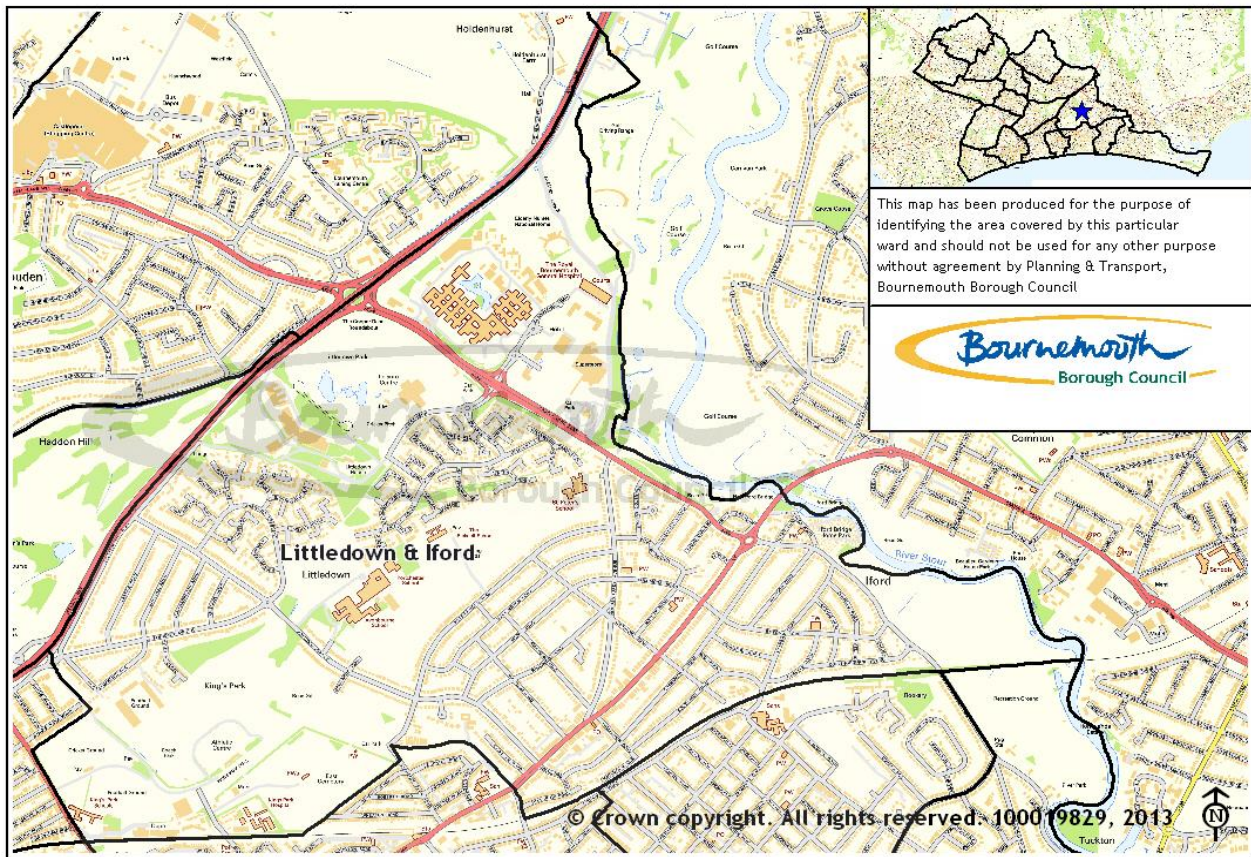


Littledown and Iford 2011 Census Factsheet



Littledown & Iford ward has a resident population of 9,726 with 4,046 households and an average household size of 2.4. Average household size is higher than the Borough figure and in line with England and Wales. The ward is less densely populated than Bournemouth overall. The ward has a larger proportion of residents aged under 18 than in Bournemouth with a slightly larger proportion of residents aged 45-64. The average age for the ward is slightly older than Bournemouth at 41.9. The ward is slightly less ethnically diverse than the Bournemouth with 88% of residents describing themselves as White British. The second largest group is White Other with 3.5% of residents included in this group which is smaller than the percentage in Bournemouth.

Unemployment in this ward is relatively low with just 3.5% unemployment compared with 5.5% in Bournemouth. The ward has a higher percentage of self-employment than in England and Wales. Turning to the economically inactive population just over 56% of this population are retired. A slightly larger proportion (14%) are looking after the home or family compared with Bournemouth as a whole. The percentage of sick or disabled is lower than the comparator areas.

Owner occupation is particularly high in this ward with nearly 78% of households owning their own home. The percentage renting from the public sector is much smaller than both locally and nationally. Nearly 62% of household spaces are in detached houses, with over three-quarters of household spaces in houses or bungalows overall.

The ward comprises of 12% of households with lone pensioners and 24% of households with at least one member with a limiting long-term illness. The percentage of lone parent households is lower than the comparator areas while the percentage of households with dependent children is higher than Bournemouth and slightly smaller than England and Wales. The ward has a very small percentage of households without central heating and only 14% of households don't have a car. A relatively small percentage of households live in overcrowded accommodation.

The residents of this ward are well qualified with only 15% of over 16s without any qualifications. Just over 50% are employed in managerial or professional occupations compared with 41% nationally.

Explanatory Notes

Usual resident

The main population base for outputs from the 2011 Census is the usual resident population as at census day 27 March 2011.

For 2011 Census purposes, a usual resident of the UK is anyone who, on census day, was in the UK and had stayed or intended to stay in the UK for a period of 12 months or more, or had a permanent UK address and was outside the UK and intended to be outside the UK for less than 12 months.

Household

A household is defined as one person living alone, or a group of people (not necessarily related) living at the same address who share cooking facilities and share a living room or sitting room or dining area. A household must contain at least one person whose place of usual residence is at the address.

Communal establishment

A communal establishment is an establishment providing managed residential accommodation. 'Managed' in this context means full-time or part-time supervision of the accommodation.

Dependent child

A dependent child is a person aged 0 - 15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16-18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.

Ethnicity

Ethnic group classifies people according to their own perceived ethnic group and cultural background.

Occupational , Employment, Economic Activity and Qualification Characteristics

Refers to population aged 16-74 with the exception of qualifications which refers to population aged 16 and over

For the Census; part-time is defined as working 30 hours or less a week. Full-time is defined as working 31 or more hours a week.

Accommodation Type

In commercial building' includes in an office building; or hotel; or over a shop.

Tenure

Owner occupiers include those who own outright, households with a mortgage and loan and shared ownership.

Rented privately include renting through a private landlord or letting agency, other and living rent free.

Renting publicly includes renting from the council, registered social landlord, housing association, housing co-operative or charitable trust.

Bedrooms

The number of bedrooms in a household's accommodation. A bedroom is defined as any room that was intended to be used as a bedroom when the property was built, or any room that has been permanently converted for use as a bedroom. It also includes all rooms intended for use as a bedroom even if not being used as a bedroom at the time of the Census.

Rooms

The number of rooms in a household's accommodation. The definition of a room does not include bathrooms, toilets, halls or landings, or rooms that can only be used for storage. All other rooms, for example, kitchens, living rooms, bedrooms, utility rooms, studies and conservatories are counted.

Occupancy rating

Occupancy rating provides a measure of whether a household's accommodation is overcrowded or under occupied. There are two measures of occupancy rating, one based on the number of rooms in a household's accommodation, and one based on the number of bedrooms. The ages of the household members and their relationships to each other are used to derive the number of rooms/bedrooms they require, based on a standard formula. The number of rooms/bedrooms required is subtracted from the number of rooms/bedrooms in the household's accommodation to obtain the occupancy rating. An occupancy rating of -1 implies that a household has one fewer room/bedroom than required, whereas +1 implies that they have one more room/bedroom than the standard requirement.

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
