
ODPM Generalised Land Use Database Statistics in England, 2001

How data is derived:

The following simplified categories are used to form the (experimental) land use statistics:

- Domestic Building
- Gardens
- Non-domestic buildings
- Roads
- Rail
- Paths
- Greenspace
- Water
- Other (largely hardstandings)

They have been provided for all of England as at 2001. These statistics have derived from the Generalised Land Use Database for England and have been calculated for each local authority area and ward and divided into the above categories.

Points to note:

The Office of the Deputy Prime Minister (ODPM) has published experimental statistics for land use. Since they are experimental statistics, the methodology and quality of the statistics are still being enhanced.

The Bournemouth wards data is available below.

Basic analysis of maps & data:

s The map opposite illustrates the percentage of roads within each ward in Bournemouth.

Moordown (22.29%), East Cliff and Springbourne (19.95) and Winton East (19.48) have the highest percentage of roads in their wards, whereas in Throop and Muscliff (9.27%) and Kinson North (10.15%) only 10% of the wards (approximately) are roads.

The majority of the southern Bournemouth wards are 15-20% roads (dark orange colour). These wards also happen to have the smallest areas (ha) however, which could account for the slightly elevated percentages

Bournemouth has the highest percentage of roads of all of the districts in the Dorset sub region (14.10%), closely followed by Poole (9.22%), despite having one of the smallest areas (4,617 ha). (For example, Poole has 6,475 ha and Christchurch has 5,043 ha).
